Part 4 The simple past to talk about memories and bios

In order to talk about memories and bios, we use the past. We will use two structures:

USED TO

Affirmative sentence: I <u>used to</u> play the violin at a very early age.

Negative sentence: I did not use to play the piano.

Yes/No question: **Did you use to** practice a lot?

Information question: How much time did you use to practice in a day?

Note: We follow the same structure for all the nouns: I , you, he, she, it, we, you, they.

DID (the auxiliary that indicates past)

Pay attention to regular and irregular verbs. We are working only with regular verbs in this part.

Affirmative sentence: I played the violin at a very early age. (we add –ied, -ed or –d in the verb no matter the noun).

Negative sentence: I **did not play** any other instrument. (The main verb does not suffer changes, the auxiliary did indicates the past).

Yes/No question: **Did you play** any other instrument? (Because it is a question, the auxiliary goes at the beginning. It indicates the past and the main verb does not need changes).

Information question: What **did you do** with your first violin?(You have a Wh-?, auxiliary verb **did,** pronoun, main verb in base form, complement and question mark)
