Meaning The present progressive is a verb tense which is used to talk about future arrangements. A future arrangement is a plan that you have decided and organized with another person.	Form + am/is/are + verbing + comp. -Statement: You are seeing your friends tomorrow. -Question: Are you watching TV this afternoon? -Negative: You are not having a class next week.	Use 2: Time expressions are often used when present continuous is used to talk about future arrangements. 1. I'm working over the New Year. 2. They are flying to New York tomorrow morning. 3. So what are we all doing at Christmas?
		4. I'm going to bed now.
